PRESENTER QUALIFICATIONS

Presenters featured at the event must be:

- qualified to speak on the topic specified and must be able to provide his/her credentials.
- comfortable speaking before a large audience and an effective communicator, and prior experience teaching clinics at other major horse expos is preferred.
- able to provide a professional, polished presentation that is suitable for all members of a "family" audience.
- available to finalize necessary details.

APPLICATION PROCESS
